Ready? Come on, put on your shoes and let's go to the woods!



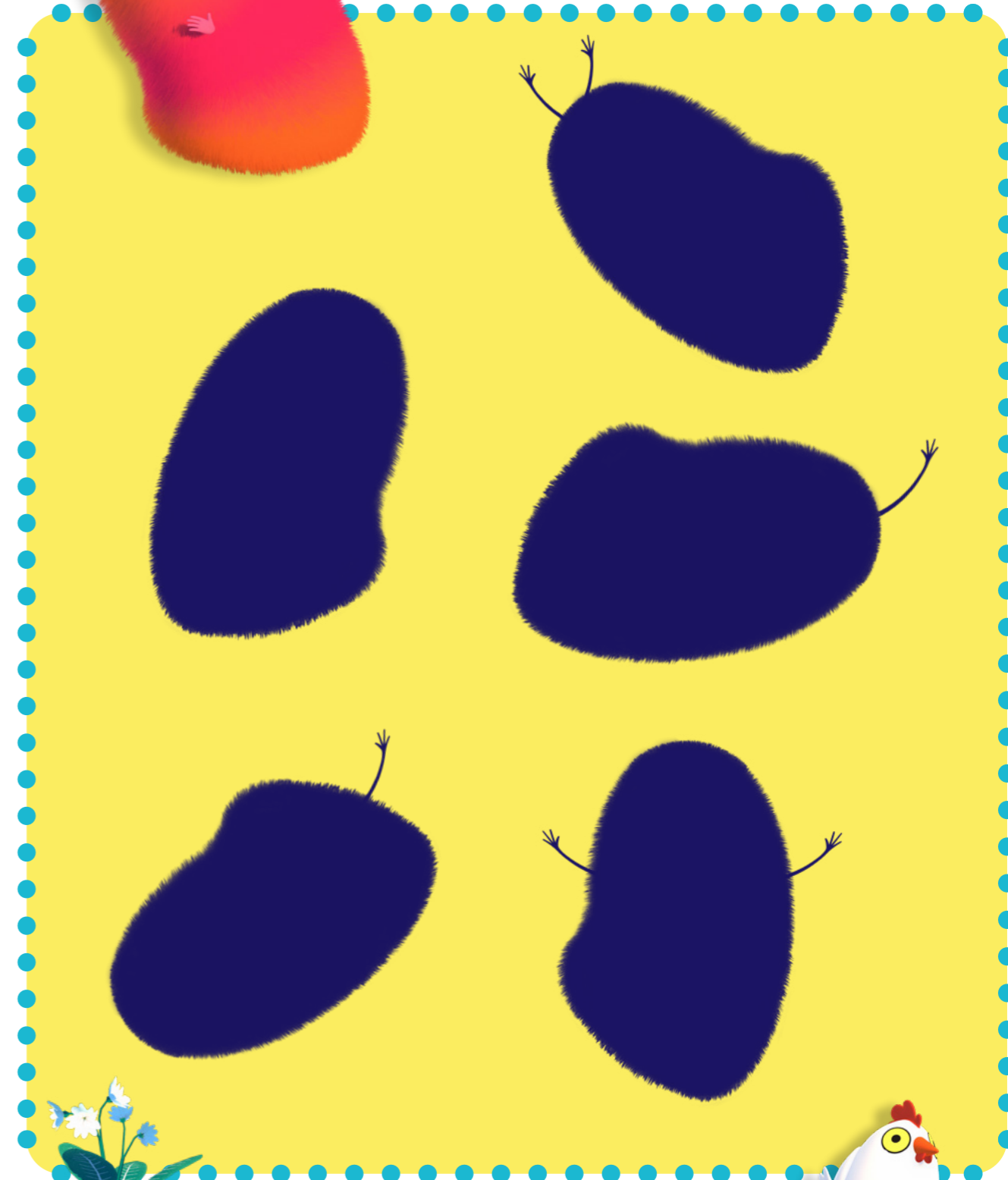
Spot the differences

Where is The Thing's shadow?

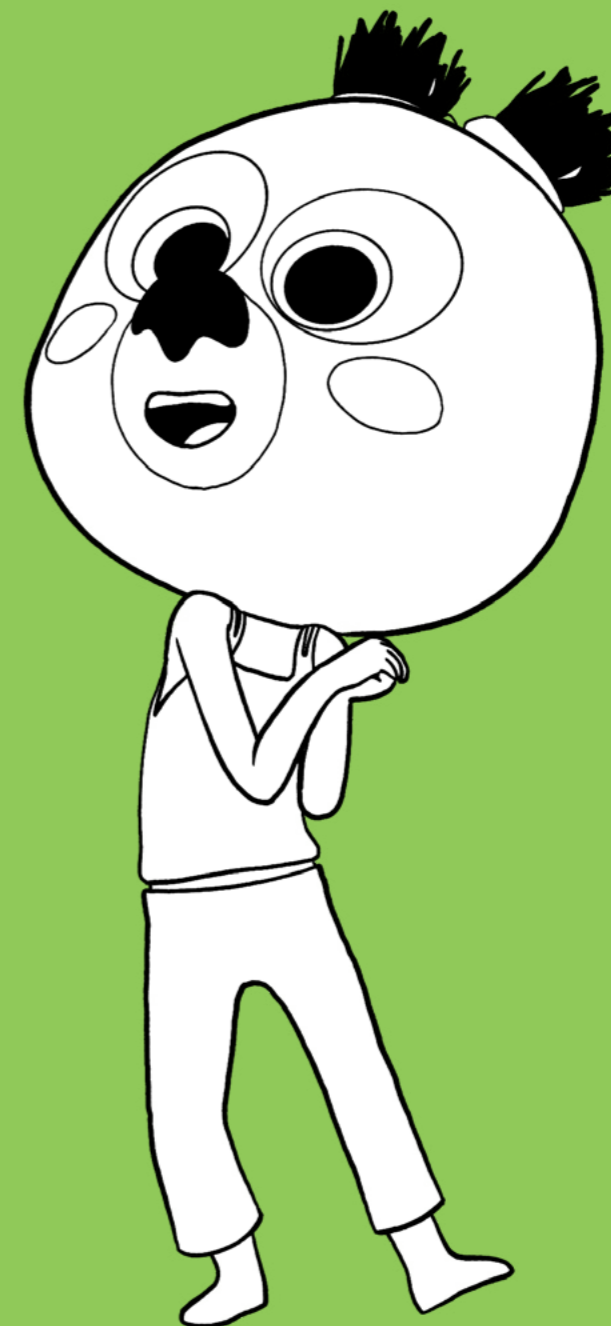
The Thing lost her shadow! Help her find it!

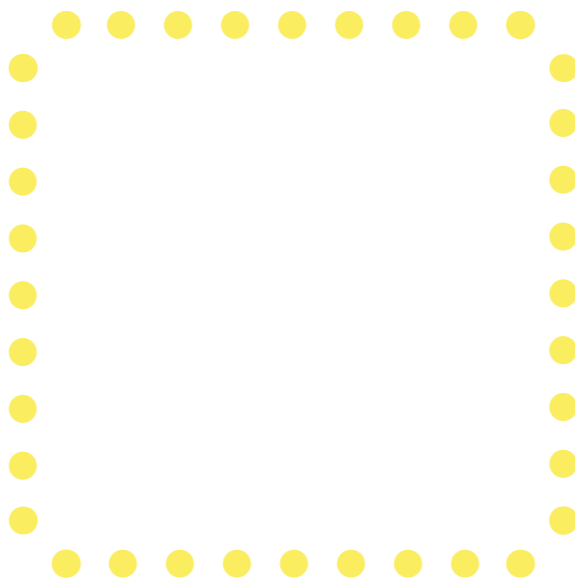
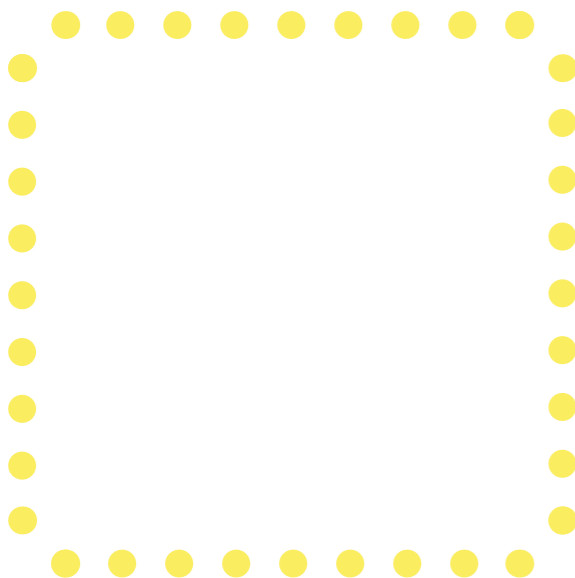


Circle the fruits and vegetables that grow in the summer.

Match each character with their favorite object.

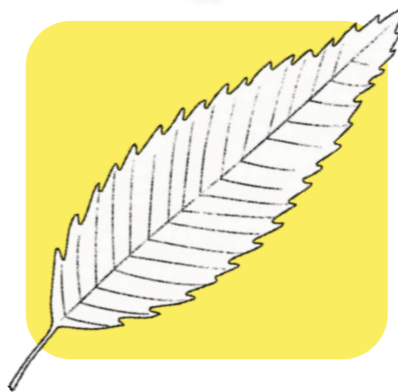
Look & find

What do you think the Featherstag looks like? Cut out the items and let's make yours!

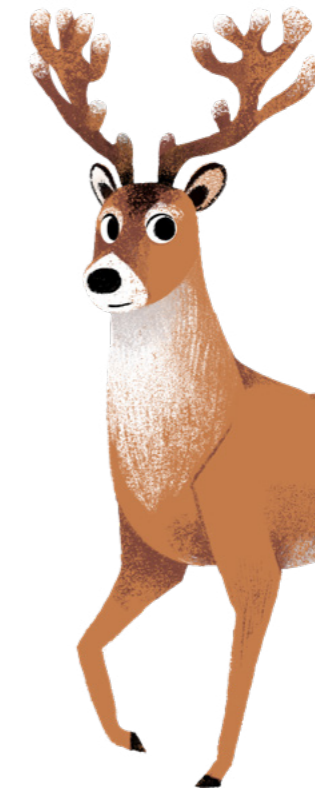


Names in desarray

Your family tree

Let's read the trees' age!

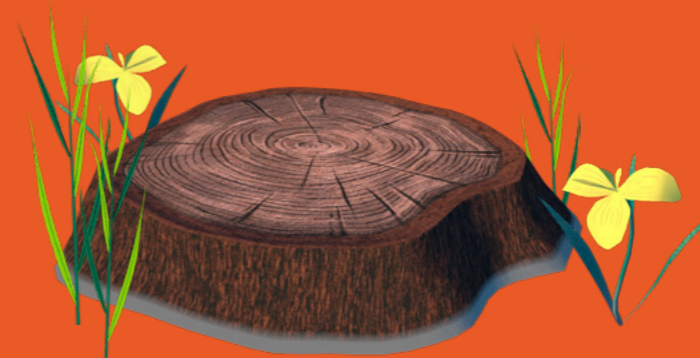
First things first, look for a tree stump in a park or in the woods. Can you see the colored rings on the stump?

Autumn recipe

The delicious chestnut cream

Chestnuts grow from September till the beginning of November. Did you know that? If it's fall as you read this phrase, maybe chestnuts are ready to be picked up in the woods near where you live.

If that's the case, grab a basket and go look for them with your parents!



Ingredients for the chestnut cream... my favorite!

- The chestnuts you gathered
- Sugar (half a volume of sugar for one volume of chestnuts)
- Water (half a volume of water for one volume of sugar)
- A vanilla bean
- A grown-up



1. Ask the grown-up to cut into the chestnuts shells and to boil them for 10 minutes.
2. Once they are drained and cooled down, have fun peeling the shells!
3. Ask the grown-up to boil them again, this time for about 20 minutes.
4. Blend them or mash them.
5. In a saucepan bring the water, sugar and vanilla beans to a boil over medium heat.
6. Add the chestnut cream and stir for 10 minutes.
7. Yum, it's ready! Enjoy it on toasts, crêpes, or stirred into yogurts. Keep the chestnut spread in a jar, in the fridge, for up to 5 days.
